

Sample legacy clauses

Leaving a legacy to Seed International Fund Trust



Different Types of Legacy

- A **residuary legacy** is a percentage of your remaining estate, after gifts to family and friends have been distributed and other expenses have been paid.
- A **pecuniary legacy** is a specific amount of money.
- A **specific legacy** is a non-cash gift, for example property, shares or a personal item of value.

If you would like to remember SIFT in your will here is some suggested wording which your solicitor might like to use. Please note that this is not intended as legal advice. We recommend seeking legal advice when writing or updating your will to make sure that your wishes are carried out.

Sample Residuary Clause

I give _____% of my real and personal property not hereby or by any codicil hereto specifically disposed of after payment of my debts, pecuniary and specific legacies, funeral and administration expenses and any taxes in respect of my estate to Seed International Fund Trust, 1 Harepath Road, Seaton, Devon, EX12 2RP, Registered Charity Number 1094193 for the general purposes of the charity.

I direct that the receipt of the duly authorised officer of Seed International Fund Trust shall be a sufficient discharge for my Executor/Trustees.

Sample Pecuniary Clause

I give the sum of £_____ free of tax to Seed International Fund Trust, 1 Harepath Road, Seaton, Devon, EX12 2RP, Registered Charity Number 1094193 for the general purposes of the charity.

I direct that the receipt of the duly authorised officer of Seed International Fund Trust shall be a sufficient discharge for my Executor/Trustees.

Sample Specific Gift Clause

I give my [short, clear description of property given] free of tax to Seed International Fund Trust, 1 Harepath Road, Seaton, Devon, EX12 2RP, Registered Charity Number 1094193 with the right to realise such assets and apply the proceeds for the general purposes of the charity.

I direct that the receipt of the duly authorised officer of Seed International Fund Trust shall be a sufficient discharge for my Executor/Trustees.
