

Sowing seeds of hope in Nicaragua

Many Nicaraguan families cook on open wood fires which fill their homes with smoke and lead to an increased incidence of respiratory disease. This method of cooking uses a lot of wood so is either expensive for families who buy their wood or very time consuming for people who gather it.

SIFT is providing families on the island of Ometepe with healthier cookers which remove harmful smoke from the home through a chimney. The cookers also use less wood, enabling families to use their time and money for other things. So far we have been able to provide 40 families with healthier cookers.

Rosario (pictured right), who received one of the cookers, said "It's excellent – very good! More than anything, it provides protection from the smoke. Now there isn't any contamination from smoke in the kitchen – it all goes outside and doesn't make the kitchen dirty. It's very good!"

Dr Sandra Villagra

Sandra has led our medical work since 2003 and trained all of our

nurses. She says that it is a great blessing for her to be able to provide treatment for patients who wouldn't otherwise be able to afford it as there is nothing more frustrating for a doctor than having to tell a patient they can't help them.

Alex Flores As well as treating patients in our clinic at San Jose, Alex makes home visits to elderly and house-bound patients. He takes great pleasure in seeing that his patients are happy with the care that he gives them. He is also sometimes able to help his patients spiritually, explaining to them that God is the best doctor.





Marlene Hemández Marlene knows how to make cough linctus and other remedies from natural sources and is able to share this knowledge with her patients. She also visits the school in San Jose to teach the pupils about topics such as hand-washing and personal hygiene to help them avoid infections.
