



It's been another busy but rewarding year for the SIFT Team as we continue working to improve the lives of the poor in Nicaragua. As we near the end of 2017 we thought we would share some of our highlights with you.

Healthcare island of Ometepe treated 3,814 patients, prescribing free medicines to those who need them. They have also

taught their patients about topics such as hand washing, dental hygiene and tropical diseases in order to help them live healthier lives. Our team continues to run targeted support groups according to community needs. This year they have

run two groups for expectant mothers as well as a luncheon club for the elderly. From time to time the team are able to undertake larger projects which help the wider community and this year Dr Sandra oversaw the construction of a water tank in the village of El Corozal delivering water for the whole community.



Hogar de Fe

This year we continued to support the ministry of the Hogar de Fe Orphanage. The orphanage is currently home to 49 children and young people and is run by

the family of Pastor Ramiro Blandón. They provide the children in their care with educational and spiritual support, helping them with their homework and involving

them in the local church. The young people also have English and IT lessons in order to give them the best chance of finding employment when they are older. This year five of the young people started university in Managua. They live in one of two transition houses which the team have set up in order to encourage them to become more independent in preparation for adult life.



Education We support children to get a better education on the island of Ometepe and the town of Bluefields. This year we enabled 138 children and young people to attend primary and secondary school or university in Bluefields. Our students go to feepaying schools which offer a higher standard of education. Margaret Storey has proved invaluable



again this year. She visits all of the schools to check on each student's progress and provides pastoral and practical support to them and their families.

Casa Rahab The city of Granada is very popular with tourists. Sadly it also attracts people looking for sex and as a result many children and young people get caught up in the sex trade. Casa Rahab (Rahab's House) is a Christian centre which is seeking to break this cycle of exploitation and to provide hope to young women who have been affected by the sex trade. The team provides them with counselling, educational support and practical skills to help them find alternative means of supporting themselves financially. Since it opened in 2014 Casa Rahab has helped more than 80 young women. SIFT has funded a sewing teacher and psychologist.

Feeding Programme Children on the island of Ometepe are at risk of malnutrition due to the lack of protein and vegetables in their diet. The feeding programme which SIFT supports is run by local Christians and provides high vitamin milk to between 40 and 45 children twice a week. Once a week the children are also given a meal of rice fortified with soya, chicken and vegetables. The sessions also include a Bible story and Christian songs because the team want the children and their parents to know God's love.
